Notice: Congregational Meeting September 12, 2020 7:00pm

The Staff and Ministry Team of GBC is planning and recommending the re-opening of the Children's Ministry and the Nursery to commence in the middle of October. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions, the recommendation is to provide for ministry rooms to be confined to the Sanctuary Level of the church.

The Board supports this recommendation and passed the following Motion to be presented to the Membership at a duly called Business Meeting for Sept. 12, 2020 at 7pm in the Church Sanctuary.

Motion: That we commence with Phase 1 of the reconstruction of the Bistro, Library and Office Re-location. This would include the following projects:

- Construction of a storage area at the front of the sanctuary to the right of the platform, to accommodate our extra chairs and tables. The design as per posted diagrams.
- Construction of a wall with doors to match the rear Bistro wall; providing privacy to the current library area. This wall would also provide space for the church mailboxes.
- Enlarge the Bistro with the removal of the storage room, this new, large space would also have a new dropped ceiling. This space would serve as the new library and a ministry space for the Sunday Children's Ministry.
- A temporary space would be provided in our current Library area for the Infant Nursery.
- Capital cost of Phase 1 will not exceed \$15,000.00; the Board recommends to establish a Capital Fund for this project.
- The future re-location of the Church Offices into the current Library space to be completed in the late spring of 2021 would require an estimated additional Capital Fund of \$50,000.00
- Complete details to be provided at the Business Meeting of September 12, 2020.

Duly passed by the GBC Board on August 27, 2020 by unanimous vote.

Scripture Reading

Acts 16: 1-15 NKJV

Then he came to Derbe and Lystra. And behold, a certain disciple was there, named Timothy, the son of a certain Jewish woman who believed, but his father was Greek. He was well spoken of by the brethren who were at Lystra and Iconium. Paul wanted to have him go on with him. And he took him and circumcised him because of the Jews who were in that region, for they all knew that his father was Greek. And as they went through the cities, they delivered to them the decrees to keep, which were determined by the apostles and elders at Jerusalem. So the churches were strengthened in the faith, and increased in number daily.

Now when they had gone through Phrygia and the region of Galatia, they were forbidden by the Holy Spirit to preach the word in Asia. After they had come to Mysia, they tried to go into Bithynia, but the Spirit did not permit them. So passing by Mysia, they came down to Troas. And a vision appeared to Paul in the night. A man of Macedonia stood and pleaded with him, saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." Now after he had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go to Macedonia, concluding that the Lord had called us to preach the gospel to them.

Therefore, sailing from Troas, we ran a straight course to Samothrace, and the next day came to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is the foremost city of that part of Macedonia, a colony. And we were staying in that city for some days. And on the Sabbath day we went out of the city to the riverside, where prayer was customarily made; and we sat down and spoke to the women who met there. Now a certain woman named Lydia heard us. She was a seller of purple from the city of Thyatira, who worshiped God. The Lord opened her heart to heed the things spoken by Paul. And when she and her household were baptized, she begged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come to my house and stay." So she persuaded us.

What does Jesus desire?

He desires that His people be with Him. Jesus is completely happy and satisfied as He reigns from heaven, but according to His prayer in John 17, He still has a certain unfulfilled desire: that His people join Him in the home He has already prepared for them (John 14:2–4).

When a brother or sister in the Lord graduates to Glory, we should remember first and foremost that the Father has answered Jesus's prayer. God is sovereign over our loved ones' deaths, and He has purposes we may never understand (Deuteronomy 32:39; James 4:15), but we can cling to the truth that Jesus has prayed for His Father to bring His people home. Yes, we have lost. We will never again share sweet fellowship with that brother or sister in this life. The magnitude of the loss often eludes our words. But the loss is never beyond Jesus's words: "Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see My glory."

Jesus knows He has a glory that is far beyond anything this world can offer. He knows that a true sight of Him is worth more than millions of worlds. He knows that the sight of His glory will leave no one unsatisfied.

Jesus is eager for His precious saints to enter true, eternal happiness with Him.

We certainly taste many joys in this life, but nothing can compare to the pure delight of unhindered fellowship with Jesus. We are destined for unspeakable joy in His presence.

Failed Again

After beginning by means of the Spirit, are you now trying to finish by means of the flesh?

Galatians 3:3

Back in my sermon-making days I approached some Sunday mornings feeling like a lowly worm. During the week before, I had not been the best husband, father, or friend. I felt that before God could use me again I had to establish a track record of right living. So I vowed to get through the sermon as best I could and try to live better the coming week.

That was not the right approach. In Galatians 3 it's said that God continually supplies us with His Spirit and works powerfully through us as a free gift—not because we've done anything or deserve it.

Abraham's life demonstrates this. At times he failed as a husband. For example, he twice put Sarah's life in jeopardy by lying to save his own skin (Genesis 12:10–20; 20:1–18). Yet his faith "was credited to him as righteousness" (Galatians 3:6). Abraham put himself in God's hands despite his failures, and God used him to bring salvation to the world through his lineage.

There's no justification for behaving badly. Jesus has asked us to follow Him in obedience, and He supplies the means to do so. A hard, unrepentant heart will always hinder His purposes for us, but His ability to use us doesn't depend on a lengthy pattern of good behavior. It's based solely on God's willingness to work through us as we are: saved and growing by grace. You don't have to work for His grace—it's free.
